



Sale of Food During the Jokkmokk Market 2027

Those of you who will be selling food products during the Jokkmokk Market must have a valid registration or approval of a food establishment from your home municipality or from Jokkmokk Municipality.¹ An application for registration must be submitted to the Environmental Office no later than 14 days before you plan to start your business.

The registration must be kept accessible at the sales location. During the Market, the Environmental Office in Jokkmokk will visit the area, and valid registrations must be available for inspection.

Provide the correct information in accordance with the Food Information Regulation

Food products that is sold at a market where the customer has direct contact with the seller does not need to have written labelling. Below is a description of the information that must be provided or made available if the customer asks. Please note that the type of information that must be provided depends on the type of food products you are selling.

Packaged food

The following applies to those who sell food products at the market in sealed bags, boxes, etc., or who package food at the customer's request (for example, sweets, nuts, cheese and bread):

- Information about allergenic ingredients must always be provided.² This can be done either verbal or in writing. If the information is provided in verbal, there must always be a specific notice informing consumers that the information is available. For example, a sign at the serving area could say:

"Do you have an allergy? You can always ask us about the contents."

The following information must be available (in writing or verbal) if the consumer asks:

- Name/designation – a name that describes what type of food it is.
- Ingredients – the information does not have to be provided in a specific order.
- Net quantity – weight or volume.
- Best-before date or last use-by date.
- Special storage and/or conditions of use.
- Name of the business and contact details – for the person/business that prepared and/or packaged the food.
- Country of origin or place of provenance – for certain foods.
- Instructions for use how the food should be prepared or cooked - if necessary.
- Alcohol content by volume – for beverages containing more than 1.2% alcohol by volume.³

Unpackaged food

The following applies to those who sell unpackaged food (for example, suovas kebab, sausages, hamburgers, etc.):

- Information about allergenic ingredients must always be provided.⁴ This can be done either verbal or in writing. If the information is provided in verbal, there must always be a specific notice informing consumers that the information is available. For example, a sign at the serving area could say:
“Do you have an allergy? You can always ask us about the contents.”
- It is mandatory to provide the name/designation of the food (a name that describes what type of food it is) if the consumer asks for this information.

Adequate protection of food products

Food protection, such as transparent covers, is intended to protect products from contaminants in the air, such as snow, dust, bacteria, viruses, etc. Food protection is required for all unpackaged food products, which may include, for example, candy strips or food samples.

Store your food at the correct temperature

Food that is intended to be kept frozen must be stored at -18°C or colder. If the air temperature is warmer than this, some form of freezer storage must be available at the sales location.

During hot holding, the food must be kept at a temperature of at least +60°C, and during heat treatment, the temperature must reach at least +72°C.
